### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY (OVERVIEW):

The attached presentation sets out the first draft of an ICP Maturity self-assessment to stimulate review and discussion

During discussions with the CCG executive, ICS and the three ICPs it was felt that following the publication of the White Paper on the future of integrated health and social care, that it was timely for the ICPs to undertake a maturity assessment to determine their readiness for the change.

It is an ideal opportunity for the ICPs to review where they are now and potentially what steps and actions that are needed to enable the ICP to step forward to take more responsibility for delivery in the run up to April 22 and the readiness to take on a Leadership role at Place under the new commissioning model from 22 onwards.

The attached presentation will be discussed at the Board but is circulated ahead of the Board meeting to enable Board members to review some of the detail to inform the discussions.
