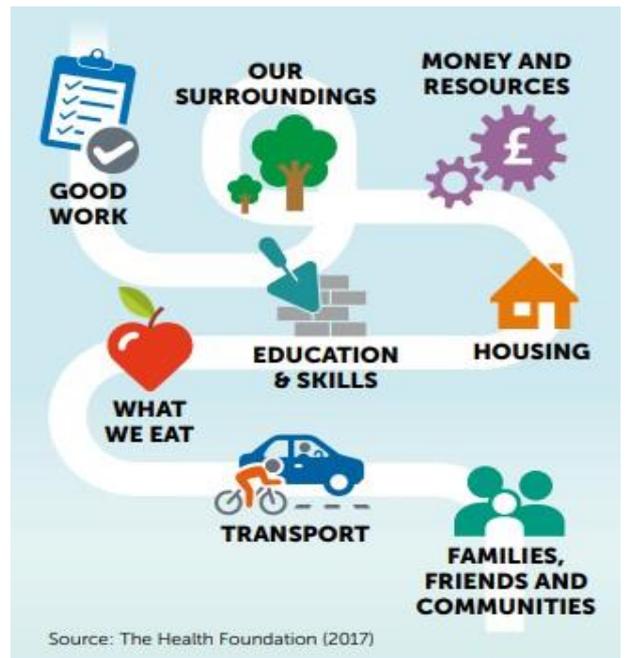

Our Place Plan 2025-26

This document is aimed at system and operational leaders working as partners of our Mid Nottinghamshire Place Based Partnership (PBP) to set out our strategic direction for the partnership and our areas of focus, through partnership programmes and integrated teams. Our Mid Nottinghamshire PBP is a key delivery vehicle and integral part of the wider Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care System family.

This plan sets out who we are, our challenges, what we have achieved, what we want to achieve together in the future working towards a shared vision and priorities, how we intend to achieve this through our programmes of work, how we intend to know we are adding real value and making an impactful difference in serving our populations and supporting our workforce.

This Plan should be considered alongside:

- **The Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care Strategy 2023-27 (updated March 2025).**
- **The Nottinghamshire Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy 2022-26**
- **Ashfield's Be Healthy, Be Happy Strategy 2021-25 (Currently being refreshed)**
- **Mansfield's Towards 2030: A Plan for Wellbeing (Refreshed 2024)**
- **Newark and Sherwood's Health and Wellbeing Strategy 2022-2026**
- **Nottingham and Nottinghamshire NHS Joint Forward Plan 2023-2027** (The NHS element of the Integrated Care Strategy – refreshed in **March 2025**).
 - Mid Nottinghamshire PBP will continue to identify specific opportunities within its delivery plans to support with the prevention and proactive care for long term condition management (all age) and our most frail population, helping to drive forward system wide transformation delivery.

Challenges

This plan has been developed in a national context of reduced healthy life expectancy, increasing health inequalities and an ageing and growing population with evolving health and care needs.

During the delivery of our plan we know we will have to navigate a number of evolving issues, such as Public Sector Reforms and the publication of the NHS 10 Year Plan, due for publication in late Spring. However, we remain committed and ambitious for our people and communities in Mid Nottinghamshire and know that by working together we can deliver the ambitions in this refreshed Place Plan, respond to the challenges facing us today, improve health outcomes over the longer term by building on our partnership and community assets through place leadership and neighbourhood based integrated working.

Mid Nottinghamshire

Key health challenges for Mid Nottinghamshire

People living in the more deprived areas have higher levels of unemployment, lower levels of qualifications, less healthy lifestyle choices and poorer health and wellbeing outcomes compared to those in less deprived areas.

POPULATION

The registered population in Mid Nottinghamshire was 349,364 in Apr 2025.

- The population is made up of 50.2% female and 49.8% male
- The area's 10-year population increase since 2015 is 8.7%

AGE

Mid Notts population is older than England average and getting older.

- 20.7% are aged 65+ [Higher than the national average (20.1% compared to 18.6%)].

Since 2011:

- 65+ population has increased by 31.8%
- 0-19yrs has increased by 7.5%.

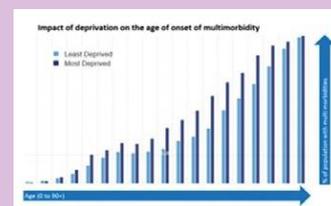
HEALTH INEQUALITIES

There is a higher percentage of multi-morbidities for those populations who are most deprived. This is a particularly marked between 45 and 70 years.

78% of Mid Notts population report they are in good or very good health. England and Wales average is 80%.

21.3% of Mid Notts population are 'disabled under the Equality Act'.

6.7% of Mid Notts population are 'not disabled but have a long-term physical or mental condition'.



ETHNICITY

Mid Notts population is less diverse than the national average.

91.1% of the population identifying as White British compared to 74.4% nationally.

Asian/Asian British is the second largest ethnic group in Mid Notts (1.8%) [2021 Census].

LIFE EXPECTANCY

Mid Notts females and males are below the England average for life expectancy.

BEST START

22,000 of 0-19 years in Mid Notts had a recording of a mental health condition, majority are low complexity and in medium or high deprivation, evenly spread through each year of age. (75,000 0-19 years).

849 mothers reported to have a smoking history (in last two years). 62% were in the highest deprivation.

LIVING WELL

There were almost 3,000 potential years lost across Mid Notts in male citizens during 2020 (1177 in female citizens) due to alcohol.

Ashfield, Mansfield and Newark & Sherwood have three of the four highest smoking prevalence (ranging from 16.5% to 23.1%) in Nottinghamshire where the average is 15.4%.

Residents of Mansfield and Ashfield are 10% below the national average in achieving recommended physical activity levels.

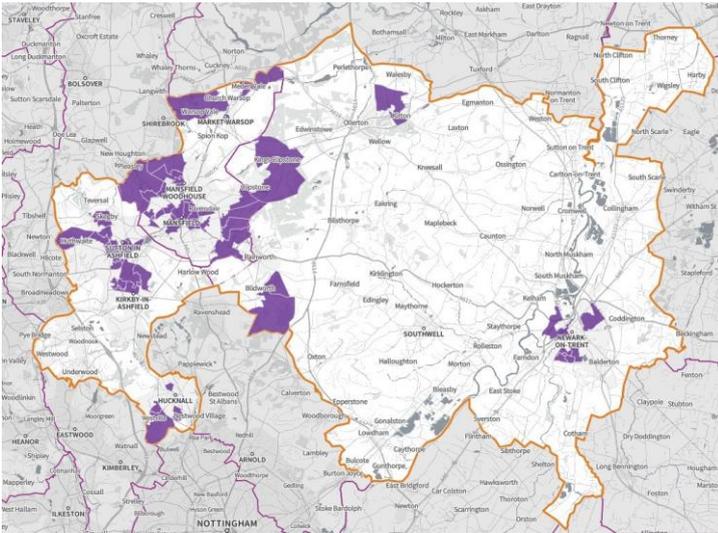
AGEING WELL

Older people who are severely frail are 13.8 times more likely to have a hospital admission. Those who live alone are 8.8 times than those not living alone.

Mid Notts has the largest number of people identified as severely frail compared to other Nottinghamshire Places.

The Mid Notts PCNs have the highest percentages of older people living alone (15% to 20%).

Our CORE20 Target Population



28.5% of population living in most deprived quintile.

- Ashfield - 29.3%
- Mansfield - 42%

Mid Notts IMD score is 24.6%, 2.9% higher than England IMD score (21.7%)

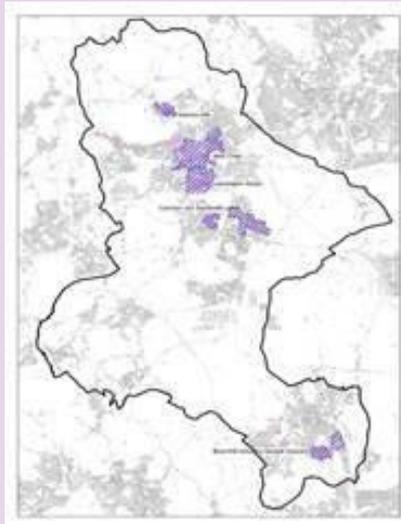
7,465 0-14yr olds and 14.1% aged 65+ living in income deprivation decile 1.

There is a total of 211 Lower Super Output Areas (LSOA) areas in Mid Notts:

- Approximately 58 LSOA areas are in the 20% most deprived nationally.
- Approximately **28% of the Mid Notts population live in an area of high deprivation.**
- Ashfield and Mansfield have identified the following priority neighbourhoods:

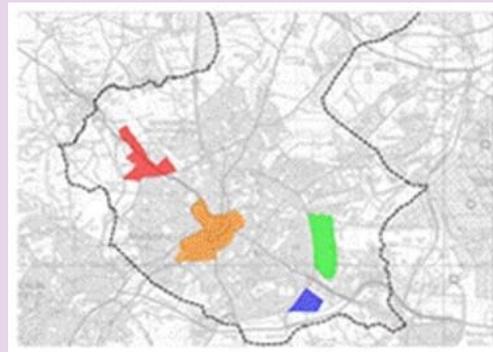
Ashfield Identified Neighbourhoods

Our Place Based Partnership

Our Mid Nottinghamshire PBP has a long history of collaborative working to address the population needs of its 349,364 citizens building upon the successful Mid Nottinghamshire Better Together Alliance. To deliver our vision “Working together to enable everyone across Ashfield, Mansfield, Newark and Sherwood to live healthier and happier lives, to prosper in their communities and remain independent throughout life”

The Mid Nottinghamshire PBP brings together over 15 health and care organisations including local authority, commissioners, community services, primary care networks and GPs, hospitals, VCSE and citizen representatives. We have a governance structure which all partners are committed to. Governance is reviewed regularly as we continue to evolve to remain fit for purpose.

Our structure includes:

- An Executive Group.
- A Partnership Forum.
- A Health Inequalities Oversight Group (which has a number of Task and Finish Groups delivering specific pieces of work).
- District level Health and Wellbeing Partnerships and Place Boards.
- Primary Care Networks.

As we mature, success during 2025-26 will include continuation of established trusted place partnership working (through joint leadership and operational programme delivery), implementation of Integrated Neighbourhood Health Teams and the PBP being recognised as a valued delivery partner within the Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care System with opportunities for further delegated responsibilities explored. The next 12 pages provide an overview of the achievements made by Mid Nottinghamshire PBP in 2024/25.

Our Place Based Partnership

2024-25 Mid Nottinghamshire PBP Achievements

BEST START+

Ensure local prioritisation and co-ordination of the Nottinghamshire **Best Start Strategy 2021-2025** (first 1,001 days from conception to 2 years) to ensure children have the best start in life and **improve mental health support** for young people (up to 19 years 25 SEND) to help shape lifelong health and wellbeing outcomes.

Supporting Infant Feeding

UNICEF Baby Friendly Initiative

Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust (NHCT) Healthy Families Team has achieved full reaccreditation at Gold Standard. There are **3** dedicated Infant Feeding Coordinators in post within the Healthy Families Team, who are International Board Lactation Consultants and lead on this agenda.

Nottinghamshire County Council (NCC) Family Hub Service (formerly Children's Centre Service) have also achieved full reaccreditation at Gold Standard. This makes Nottinghamshire one of only a few areas in the UK where both elements of the community breastfeeding offer are at the nationally and globally recognised highest standard of care.

Sherwood Forest Hospitals Foundation Trust (SFHT) achieved UNICEF Baby Friendly Accreditation in 2014. The Maternity department achieved Level Three re-accreditation in 2019 and is working towards Gold Award status. The Neonatal Team achieved Level Two accreditation. SFHT's Lime Green Team provide that link within the very early days, ensuring more mothers are able to continue successfully on their breastfeeding journey, providing their babies with optimal nutrition from the start. The Trust is also the first in the NHS to have a feeding pod for staff and visitors and has a trust-wide policy for staff who are breast/chest feeding upon return to work.

Nottinghamshire Breastfeeding Friendly in the Community

A partnership between NCC, NHCT, all seven District/Borough Councils and Library Service, working with private and community venues. New service standards, process and documentation are being developed to improve efficiency of the accreditation process, which has now been expanded to two years, except for Family Hubs and Health Centres, which continue with annual validation with UNICEF Baby Friendly Initiative standards. All three district councils have identified Breast Feeding Friendly leads to increase the number of venues locally, with accreditation visits undertaken by the Family Hub Peer Support Volunteers and Champions, who also support the weekly BABES groups.

Increased Rates of Breast Feeding

Breastfeeding rates at 6 – 8 weeks after birth are the **highest** since records began in 2010, with a **10%** increase in Ashfield and Mansfield. This shows a real change in the culture, making breast feeding “the norm” and the impact of the range of support offered from partner organisations, with women knowing where support is available.

Childhood Vaccination and Immunisation

A measles/MMR action plan was put in place with work targeted at Mid Notts including community outreach and awareness raising with schools and early years settings. Information for families has been made more widely available (including in different languages).

Contain Outbreak Management Fund (COMF)

Using the funding received in 2023/24, a Speech, Language and Communication Needs Pilot Project was undertaken in Ashfield to inform the redesign of the early year's early intervention speech, language and communications offer across the County, resulting already in successful drop-in sessions for families across Mid-Notts.

Baby Week 2024

The Best Start Partnership led multi-agency collaboration for Baby Week for our second year. Baby Week brings local parents, carers, partners and services together to promote giving children the Best Start in Life.

Best Start in Life Core Offer

This brings together details of local support and services available for the first 1001 days of a child's life and was endorsed by the Health & Wellbeing Board in September 2024.

The guide is available in booklet form, with the digital version being hosted on the virtual family hub Notts Help Yourself.

Additional guides to the first 1001 days and transition to school have also been produced, with parents involved in guiding what content they wanted including.

Family Hub Network

Total of **9** Family Hub Networks have been launched across Mid Notts, delivering a range of services across the extended age range for families with children from pre-birth to 18.

Levelling Up funding was secured for refurbishment of the Ravensdale and Oaktree Family Hub buildings and NCC Green Initiative Funding has also been used at Newark Family Hub to re-green the outdoor play space and instigate a range of measures focused on informing and improving environmental awareness for children, families and staff.

Safety Information on Baby Products

Notts County Council's Trading Standards, Public Health and Early Years & Family Hubs services have received funding from the Office of Product Safety and Standards for a community information activity alerting families to dangers around baby items.

Front line and strategic knowledge from professionals across Mid Notts provided information on most common causes of babies being injured, resulting in **4** leaflets being produced highlighting the dangers of button batteries, dummy holders/teethers, slings and some sleep products. Resources have been developed in English, Polish, Romanian, Lithuanian and Panjabi to support the Family Hub Networks share important safety messages. Notts Help Yourself, the virtual family hub has also been updated with top tips to help keep babies safe. A social media campaign ran during April and June 2024, coinciding with Child Safety Week on Nottinghamshire Families Information Service and Family Hubs Facebook pages.

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CYP Mental and Emotional Wellbeing

In June 2024 the Ashfield Local Design Team agreed as a collective partnership that there was a need to better understand the levels of Mental Health Challenges in Ashfield. Active Notts and Ashfield District Council jointly funded a Mental Health Specialist to work specifically in Kirkby with local schools to gain insights on the challenges our children and young (CYP) people face. Through this insight work a greater collective understanding was achieved that will aid the collective approach to supporting CYP in Ashfield with Mental Health challenges.

Active Explorers

Your Health Notts, West Notts College and the School Games Project are collaborating on an exciting project to support children who are less active or who are eligible for free school meals or pupil premium, to try a range of exciting sporting sessions, free of charge. The sessions take place on a Friday afternoon 3.45 to 4.30 for children aged 5 – 12 and all abilities are welcome. So far **13** children have taken part, and sessions are planned to continue into the Summer term.

Newark and Sherwood Community Alcohol Partnership (CAP)

Newark and Sherwood District Council has officially launched their **3rd** Community Alcohol Partnership (CAP) that will cover Newark Town Centre and Hawtonville, creating a partnership to tackle underage drinking. An action plan has been created collaboratively, covering Education, Enforcement, Diversionary activities and changing public perception.

Outwood Girls

Working with the Outwood Academy, Ashfield District Council has developed a programme for girls who don't normally get involved in physical activity. Listening to the **14** girls in the first tranche, exciting activities such as glowstick aerobics, laser tag and boogie boarding have been delivered.

Gypsy Roma Traveller (GRT) Alternative Education Programme

Using UKSPF funding to address secondary school disengagement and avoidance of anti-social behaviour. Newark and Sherwood District Council are working with partners to deliver an Alternative Education Programme for the specifically for the GRT community.

Central Government Funding

Funding has been secured from central Government to set up the Thrive Tribe group at Trowell Court Community Centre, Bellamy Estate, Mansfield, to support and empower neurodivergent individuals, parents/carers, through building independence, making stronger connections and boosting confidence.

Football Foundation Funding - Ashfield

5 Play Zones approved, funded by Football Foundation, providing flat, multi-use lit spaces. All will have key-code entry systems, with organisations and individuals able to pre-book using QR code for free or at a low cost.

CVS Golden Tread Programme

Newark and Sherwood CVS have continued to positively build relationships with local young people through the Golden Thread programme, which supports young people wanting to get into further education and work by giving them access to local volunteering.

Improving School Readiness Early Years Foundation Scores

Empowering Mansfield and Ashfield Placemakers Conference was held in June 2024 with a workshop dedicated to school readiness in Mansfield. Attendees from numerous partner organisations were brought together to input in how school readiness could be improved across the district. This was further considered at the Mansfield district Best Start+ meeting in March 2025, capturing how partners can individually and collectively support this agenda.

Mini Wonders at Mansfield Museum is just one example of an initiative encouraging children and families to be "ready to learn." Mini Wonders is an early years innovation in museums project, funded by Nesta and Mansfield museum has successfully received funding for a 2-year pilot project, **1** of only **8** museums in the UK to be included.

Infant Mental Health Training for Early Years staff

Interface Enterprise were commissioned to deliver Infant Mental Health Training to early years settings during 24-25 academic year. Through September to December 2024, **14** half day sessions were delivered. The training aims to equip the workforce with knowledge and skills relating to early relationships and interaction, social and emotional development, self-regulation, and the impact of parental mental health. Across Mid-Notts **51** practitioners from **33** settings have attended.

New Home for Youth Club

Connections made through the Mansfield Woodhouse Family Hub Network and supported by Mansfield Best Start Plus partnership group have led to a new home for the Manor Youth Club and a name change! Officially known as Mansfield Woodhouse Young People's Centre, the club is now affectionately called Woodhouse Youth Club and has relocated to the Family Hub.

Mental Health Support Offer in Education Settings

CAMHS Mental Health Support Team currently cover a number of schools in the Mid Notts area.

Schools are being supported with funding from Active Notts (DfE) to help inactive young people be more active, focused on those with low level mental health and anxieties across Mid-Notts.

Our Place Based Partnership

2024-25 Mid Nottinghamshire PBP Achievements

Place Based Health Promotion Campaigns and Community Events

Ashfield Wellbeing Network Community

Event took place on 14th April 2024, at Leamington Primary School and was supported by **20** stall holders.

412 residents had conversations with the 20 stall holders.

500+ leaflets were handed out to residents.

104 referrals made to organisations.

Diabetes Health Checks.

With the support of Diabetes UK and Abbott, Ashfield South PCN were able to offer a free and comprehensive Diabetes Health check to the residents of Kirkby in Ashfield and the surrounding areas. In total we were able to test **77** people as well as bring an awareness of the risks of Diabetes, how to prevent or manage the condition, and to promote a healthy diet and active lifestyle.

'Living Well with MSK Together'

A series of community events have taken place across Mansfield, Ashfield, Newark, and Sherwood and a total of **432** people who were waiting to access the MSK service, or waiting for orthopaedic surgery attended. Everyone was welcomed by a care navigator and had a personalised 'what matters to you' conversation. This guided people to talk to the clinicians and locally available services who attended, to help them to live well with their MSK condition, both while waiting for treatment and beyond. Diverse support available ranged from District and County Council, physical and mental health and wellbeing services, exercise, and healthy eating services to financial support and VSCE organisations. On the day attendees were also able to sign up to and supported to use the NHS APP, access digital pre-op through Lifebox and even sign up to participate in MSK research.

Breast Cancer awareness and screening event

Ashfield South PCN held an event at Ashfield Health and Wellbeing Centre on 3rd October 2024, for their Breast Cancer awareness and screening event. The event was supported by UK registered charity COPPAFEEL! The aim of the event was to come together as local health, social and voluntary group providers to share knowledge and educational materials to help improve uptake of screening and ultimately saves lives.

The use of Making Every Contact Count (MECC) was applied encouraging everyone to have conversations about the importance of breast screening, in the local community.

Transport

The Mid Notts Place Team have established key transport links within Notts County Council. Meetings are underway, with a log of Transport related issues and challenges that our citizens and services face being created.

An action plan with allocated action owners has been support of the log with follow-on meetings scheduled to review progress and agree next steps to collectively, truly tackle the challenges and ensure a continuous programme of improvements.

Creative Space – Ashfield Community Hub

Opened In July 2024. The space provides a welcoming, inclusive, safe space in a non-clinical setting for Social Prescribing consultations and activities.

The space also benefits residents and PBP members across Mid Notts by providing a flexible space for support groups to meet and health education and wellness activities to take place.

The Ashfield Community Hub has featured in the Creative Works (the architects) October 2024 Newsletter, with a further link to the Health Estates Journal.

Mid Notts PBP Forum Event

On the 20th June 2024, the PBP Forum met to co-define the Living Well Theme Delivery Plan for 2024/25 and continued development of Integrated Working in Mid Notts. The event was well attended with over **50** members coming together to help shape the what the programme will look like for 2024/25.

Outreach Clinics

Positive discussions underway with to see how we can link Outreach Clinics into the SFHT Workforce Plan with positive discussions and progress made to date.

Social Prescribing

Across the 6 Mid Nottinghamshire PCN's a total of **3,257** referrals to Social Prescribers was made, resulting in **3012** care and support plans being produced. **10,750** onward referrals to services were made.

New Facility Opened

The new health hub in Warsop opened in early June 2024. Working in partnership with Vibrant Warsop, Strategic Leisure and Serco Leisure/More Leisure Community Trust. The health hub has increased accessibility for physical activity, created an attractive and fun destination for residents and visitors.

Our Place Based Partnership

Partnership Programmes - Ashfield District Council

Ashfield District Council Be Healthy, Be Happy Management Group agreed that the focus for Living Well 2024, will be centered around 'Residents from priority areas are informed and accessing the information advice and guidance they need to help them lead healthier lives'.

Coxmoor Residents Action Group (CRAG) Fun Day

Took place 17th August 2024. CRAG work together to make small changes which can make a big difference to the lives of fellow residents. Between **250** and **300** residents attended making it a wonderfully fun and successful event. Outputs from the event, linked to the Building Blocks of Health was presented to the Joint Health and Wellbeing Board on 5th March 2025.

Wellbeing Events

Ashfield District Council delivered **2** wellbeing events for staff and achieved the Employers Carers Accreditation. **280** people are receiving support through the GP Exercise Referral Scheme.

Throughout October and November 2024, ATTFE provided a series of drop-in events at The Idlewell's Shopping Centre to showcase their services on offer, provide support, information, education and career pathways.

Place Partnership Lead

Ashfield District Council and Sports England through funding employed Place Partnership Lead. The Post which is hosted by the Mid Notts Place Team has a specific focus on Leamington, which is one of our priority places. The role will directly work with the community, partners and wider organisations to understand the challenges to improve health and wellbeing, increase physical activity and tackle sedentary behaviours. This will build on the IIC work already taking place across Coxmoor.

Leisure continued to go from strength to strength, with **1,716,343** attendances recorded across the contract, with **127,626** more attendances than 2023-24. **£6,189,604** social value was generated from the contract, an increase of **£790,000** on the previous year.

Ashfield District Council achieved the Foundation Level Award for Thrive Workplace Health.

6 new nature trails were installed across parks in Ashfield.

Partnership Programmes - Mansfield District Council

Bellamy Lets Talk Diabetes event provided an opportunity to have two-way conversations between service providers and residents. They had **15** service providers attend and 20 residents. A feedback report is being developed.

Bellamy FOOD club presented at a national webinar hosted by Feeding Britain on achieving financial sustainability within affordable food settings. It is the highest performing Family Action FOOD club in the country taking about **£600** a week

Warm Welcome group secured **£1500** Shared Prosperity Funding to run Summer Fayre event for Oak Tree Community.

Small Steps to Feeling Great Partnership supports the living well agenda.

Healthy Living, Healthy Mind service offered by NHS Talking Therapies running alongside intervention.

Cardiac Rehabilitation, Diabetes, Weight Management and Menopause support groups ran by Health and Wellbeing Coaches across Mid Notts PCNs.

More Leisure have had **500** Healthy Life referrals in 2024, their highest ever!

Mansfield CVS is providing Community Transport to enable residents access health and wellbeing services with increased referrals to access food support particularly food banks.

Partnership Programmes - Newark and Sherwood District Council

NeuroFit Sessions

Working with the Specialist Neurological Physio team at Newark Hospital, Active4Today staff engaged with neurological patients with Parkinson's Disease and Functional Neurological Disorder to help develop a Neurological class for patients after discharge from hospital services. NeuroFit sessions started on Tuesday 10th September 2024 at Newark Sports and Fitness Centre. Classes are tailored to those with Parkinson's Disease and other neurological conditions.

"Know Your Numbers"

The 'Improving Healthy Lifestyles' Task and Finish Group have continued to focus and build on their findings of raised blood pressure within several workplaces in the 'Know Your Numbers' week in September 2024. This year, they extended the offer to include the NHS Diabetic Eye Screening and the Healthier You, NHS Diabetes Prevention Programme. 5 sessions over the week were held in local factories (Curry's and Bakkavor), working with their Health and Wellbeing Officers and Collingham GP surgery. Over the sessions, **94** people had Blood Pressure checks, and **37.2%** were found to have raised blood pressure. As a result of these findings, further conversations are being had about the value of, and how we engage with local workforces for their health and wellbeing.

Council's Playing Pitch Strategy and Outdoor Sport Strategy

During 2024/2025 Newark and Sherwood District Council continued to develop a portfolio of potential 3G pitch locations across the district to meet the needs identified in the Council's Playing Pitch Strategy and Outdoor Sport Strategy. The District Council has committed **£2,000,000** in its capital programme for delivery of **5** 3G pitches in partnership with Football Foundation. Site feasibility is currently being explored, with the first site to come forward in 2025/26.

Living Well Booklet

A Living Well booklet has been developed for residents who are looking for support and advice on a range of topics. The booklet contains information on where residents can access food provision across the district as well as food hubs and social supermarkets who offer affordable groceries to those who may need them, including in an emergency. In addition, the booklet gives the locations and opening hours of warm spaces, coffee mornings and social eating opportunities that are in operation across the district.

Barber Shop Initiative

Newark and Sherwood District Council commenced visits to local barber shops who are engaged in the Council's Barber Shop Initiative to promote men's health. The current focus is on promoting the suicide and mental health resources from Public Health.

CAP Innovation Fund

Active4Today have been successful in securing through the CAP Innovation Fund **£3000**. In partnership with Newark Youth Centre and Nottingham Forest Community Trust, weekly activities will be provided. Outdoor activities include football. Indoor activities include making mocktails, speakers and games in the spring of 2025.

Health Check Events

Working with Active4Today, the Council have supported Curry's with **2** health check events as part of staff wellbeing. The team completed **76** blood pressure checks, with **10** referred to their GP due to high BP. **2** referrals to Your Health Notts Stop Smoking Service.

Social Housing and Smoking Project

A Tenancy Officer has been leading on the Social Housing and Smoking Project with Public Health, the team have designed posters that have now been displayed in all community centres, with work continuing centralising information to support tenants on stop smoking/smokefree homes.

Secured further HIIIF funding to support/upskill more volunteers for the Best Years Hubs.

9 Hubs currently operational in various locations across Newark, Sherwood and Ashfield.

Total group attendances is **2961**.

Listening Line provides individuals with a weekly, friendly, social chat over the phone with a dedicated volunteer.

Best Years Hub was highly commended at the NATH Primary Care Conference in March 2025.

Advanced Care planning conversations taking place Best Years Hubs.

29 Advanced Care Plans have been completed.

A schedule of activities has been planned in consultation with service users to enhance health and wellbeing.

58 service users have accessed further benefits and blue badge support.

Listening Line is for individuals aged over 65 who are lonely and/or isolated.

Citizens Story Citizen's story presented to the NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB Board in March 2025 featuring Mavis which was positively received.

Secured funding from the HIIIF to support Advanced Care Planning/RESPECT across Newark and Sherwood and Ashfield.

Additional Funding secured from HIIIF and Newark and Sherwood District Council to sustain the hubs for a further **12** months.

Development of the Best Years Hubs

The Best Years Hubs launched in June 2024 in both Newark and Sherwood. The hubs provide residents over the age of 65 living with a long-term health condition in Newark and Sherwood, with educational groups, weekly activities, one-to-one befriending to help improve wellbeing and reduce social isolation. The hubs are delivered and supported by an integrated team of professionals and volunteers working across health, social care, local authority, community, and voluntary sectors.

So far **486** journeys have been supported through the Door 2 Door Volunteer Transport Service.

Winter Wellness events held by the Best Years Hubs across Newark and Sherwood had **93** attendances.

Members of the Hubs have enjoyed numerous trips, at no cost to themselves. These include trips to the seaside, garden centres etc.

Digital Inclusion Volunteers supporting the Best Years Hubs service users with the NHS App and other useful Apps.

95 individuals accessed support up to March 2025.

District Councils are referring into the Best Years Hubs.

Housing Officers are attending the hubs to offer support as needed, alongside Citizens Advice Central Notts (CACN).

6 monthly Showcase Event highlighting the great work and outcomes was held in December 2024 and was attended by key partners.

Best Years Hub in Ashfield supported by a public consultation with Social Prescribing Link Workers, PCN Business Managers, Lammas Leisure Centre, AVA and District Council Colleagues has commenced.

Presented to the Mid Notts PBP Forum in October 2024. Service Users were invited to attend and share their experiences of attending the hubs.

Following a facilitated session, a 'You said, we did' feedback was collated which will feed into the future planning for the hubs.

Support around CFS obtained from SFHT through meetings with the Geriatrician Service.

CFS discussed at Mansfield, Newark and Sherwood Ageing Well Task and Finish groups.

CFS discussed at Care Coordinator meeting. They are supportive of using the CFS and recording for all patients.

CFS discussed with new Integrated Neighbourhood Teams.

CFS has been added to workflows under the new Care Navigation Contract.

Ageing Well/Integrated Neighbourhood Team Working

INT is focussing on upskilling best years volunteers.

2 Integrated Neighbourhood Team Project Coordinators have commenced in post and have been aligned to their areas.

2 Integrated Neighbourhood Team Administrators have commenced in post and have been aligned to their areas.

Clinical Leads are in place for each area and PBP theme.

Mansfield Frailty Project started; Make a Start.

2 hubs operating from Bull Farm and Forest Town with over **200** attendances from Mansfield residents. Over **60%** of these attendances have been supported by the inclusion of transport to enable better access for residents. We are now looking to develop additional hubs in Warsop Parish, Oak Tree, Bellamy and Ladybrook.

My Support Network, created by the Newark LDT, launched in September 2024. The document is designed to help people in the community along with their relatives, carers, professionals and volunteers to understand who is providing support to them/their loved ones. My Support Network webpage has received **436** views from **333** users. There have been **43** file downloads.

There is a focus to expand the weekly INT meetings into the 4 neighbourhood places. Priority is the Mid Notts Extended Frailty MDT Model.

Newark and Sherwood have restructured their Ageing Well Task and Finish Group to incorporate the Best Years Hub Steering Group.

Attendance to the Tackling Loneliness Collaborative is growing.

PBP Infographic Dashboard has been developed which provides information on all 'live' projects, performance data and lived experiences (where available).

PCN Input

All **6** PCNS have actively engaged with Health Inequalities projects.

Core20Plus5 Ambassadors

There are 24 new ambassadors across the Integrated Care System in total for this year. **2** ambassadors are from the Mid Notts Place Team. Plans are in place to recruit further ambassadors.

Ashfield Care Homes Pilot

Mid Notts PBPs collaborating with Your Health Notts and Ashfield District Council to provide a free 12-week Strength Based Approach programme to care homes within the Ashfield area. **3** care homes took part in the first phase.

Diabetes Equity Payments

The ICB secured funding for **9** practices to case find patients with Type II Diabetes living in the most deprived areas to increase uptake of the 8 Care Processes. From June 2023 - July 2024, **357** patients contacted with **131** having some or all of the 8 care processes completed.

Mid Nottinghamshire Health Inequalities Oversight Group (MNHOIG)

Meetings continue to be well received, with a number of organisations in attendance, generating good conversations and outcomes.

Fibroscan

Hepatology Department at NUH working on behalf of Mid Notts PCNs have been case finding patients who are at risk of having liver disease and offered a Fibroscan. Target group are those with Type II Diabetes, have a BMI > 30 and/or hazardous alcohol use.

As of December 2024, **162** patients have been given appointment, with **9** scoring between 8-15kPa, and **24** scoring moderate to positive (>15kPa).

Better Housing, Better Health

Since the project began **200** households have been supported via emergency fuel vouchers, energy advice, debt advice, home visits, small measures, and signposting.

115 emergency fuel vouchers issued with a total value of **£6,174**.

Personalised Health Budgets (PHB) for Health Improvements

£10,000 awarded to Mid Notts to build on the existing exercise referral model.

Health and Wellbeing Coaches are case finding patients with a health condition who would benefit from exercise. As of December 2024, **77** referrals have been received, with an average spend of **£127.80**.

The project also benefitted from been match funded through HIIIF.

Lung Cancer Screening – Mansfield and Ashfield

As of February 2025, **27,641** patients were eligible for a lung health check. **21,813** patients (**79%**) accepted an assessment. **9,216 (83.1%)** were identified as high risk and were invited for a Face to Face (F2F) appointment. **8,907 (97%)** attended their F2F appointment and received a CT Scan.

From the **8,907** CT scans, **153** cancers have been diagnosed:
133 Lung Cancers, **9** Urology Cancers, **4** Upper GI Cancers, **1** Lower GI Cancer, **3** Breast Cancers, **1** Head & Neck Cancer, **2** Haematology
This is a **66%** earlier diagnosis rate.

Paediatric Asthma

Pilot ran by PICS in Mid Notts to support GP practices identify children at risk of asthma through spirometry and FeNO.

70 patients seen in total.

Physical Health Checks for SMI Patients

1,402 patients with SMI have had all six physical health checks completed in December 2024. This is 63% of all patients with SMI in Mid Notts.

Article Publication

Population Health Management of Fuel Poverty written by Dr Stephen Wormall Clinical Lead for Health Inequalities, was published in the British Journal of General Practice.

Partnership Programme - Ashfield District Council

GP Exercise Referral

406 people were referred to GP Exercise Referral at Hucknall, Lammas or Kirkby Leisure Centres between April - August 2024. In addition to this Everyone Active, who operates the leisure centres on behalf of Ashfield District Council, provided many other positive activities.

Ashfield Arts Partnership

Ashfield Arts Partnership has been successful in its applications for **£1m** investment into arts and culture in the district over the next **3** years.

UKSPF Funding

35 organisations received a share of **£38,000** UKSPF Funding to deliver activities linked to green spaces, supporting walking, cycling and/or mental health.

Ashfield Gym Passes

Ashfield District Council funded **10** gym passes to Ashfield South PCN population for a 12-week period who fit the criteria. Patients have been identified via eHealthscope as those having a BMI over 30 or recently diagnosed with hypertension and/or type II diabetes.

Partnership Programme - Newark and Sherwood

Food Coordinator

Food Coordinator started in June 2024 to widen the work the team undertake around food insecurity and to grow local access an opportunities to cookery and growing projects. Increase the number of social eating groups to address loneliness and isolation.

Create your own Worm Farm

60 families attended our first 'Create your own Worm Farm' workshop delivered in partnership with Urban Worm. Families discovered the benefits of worm composting and the ease of maintaining their own worm farm. Making a positive impact whilst creating a sustainable solution for kitchen waste, supporting families to contribute to a greener future.

The Bread-and-Butter Thing

A programme of wrap around support has been rolled out at 'The Bread-and-Butter Thing' in Hawtonville with plans to extend across all food clubs/hubs across the district. Links have been made with Citizens Advice, Better Housing-Better Health, diabetic eye screening team and many much to further support families with their health and wellbeing.

New Community Hub Opened

The new community hub opened in Boughton with a variety of services now based at the hub, engaging with families on the Boughton Estate.

Partnership Programme - Mansfield District Council

Better Housing Better Health

386 residents highlighted with COPD across Mansfield highlighted and contacted to offer support from Better Housing Better Health.

Mansfield Fuel Bank

We spent over **£10,000** in external grant funding to provide emergency fuel support. We issued **204** vouchers, supporting **323** residents, of which **243** were adults and **80** children

Partnership Programmes

Sherwood Local Design Team (LDT) produced an information booklet of community groups offering support for mental health. This was in response to colleagues in Primary Care saying they needed a quick reference sheet for use in consultations to signpost people.

Presentation and a call to action for wider partners to join us in the delivery of our ambitions on the role of the Mid Notts PBP in Tackling Health Inequality locally was presented at the **Healthwatch Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Annual Showcase 2024 and Mid Notts Community Roadshow on the 23rd July 2024.**

PBP Governance

A meeting effectiveness audit has been undertaken and findings implemented, with revised a governance structure and Terms of References approved by PBP Executives. Revised district level delivery structures to include the Place Boards and District Health and Wellbeing Partnerships was endorsed by PBP Executives 24 May 2023. Additional Roles Reimbursement Scheme (ARRS)

The Additional Roles Reimbursement Scheme (ARRS) is an NHS initiative to enable Primary Care to diversify its workforce by recruiting health care professionals, such as; Clinical Pharmacists, Paramedics, Social Prescribing Link Workers, Care Navigators and Health and Wellbeing Coaches.

The number of posts has increased for 2024/25 to **237** (197.794 WTE) posts.

For 2023/24 **223** (194.549 WTE) posts were in place.

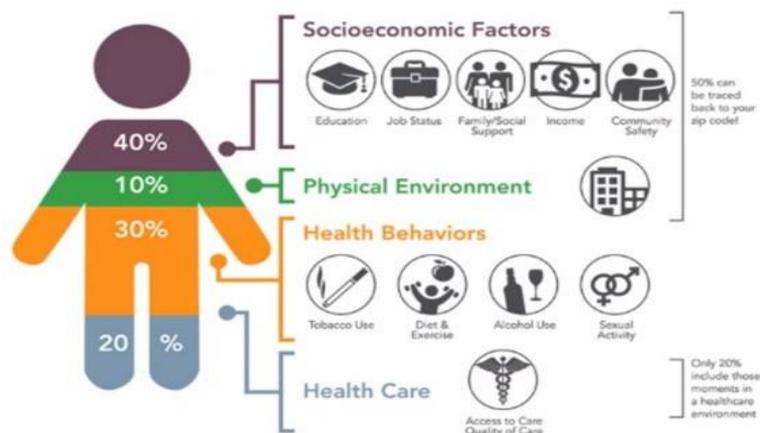

As a non-statutory partnership with partners that have their own organisational duties and responsibilities, we have sought to identify priorities that would add value and avoid duplication to the work of the partnership's constituent organisations.

Programme Structure Roles and Responsibilities

Role	High Level Responsibilities
Executive Sponsor (Accountable)	Ensure the programme delivers required outcomes and benefits, providing assurance that all partners are contributing appropriately to progress the programme and that associated risks are being managed effectively.
Programme Lead (Responsible)	Lead the programme on a day-to-day basis providing programme oversight for agreed areas of work ensuring delivery, deployment of funding, resources and risk management.
Programme Manager (Manage)	Oversee the programme management processes, including reporting and tracking of outcomes and performance information in line with agreed scope and milestones.
Programme Team (Deliver)	Come together to support the successful delivery of the programme and achievement of agreed outcomes, working on the interests of the Bassetlaw/Mid Notts population.
